

MATH

- Discuss how different months have different amounts of days. Have the students complete the worksheet “Month After Month”.
- Provide photocopies of calendars for each student. Let the students mark their classmates’ birthdays in each month. You or the student can make a graph listing the months and how many students have a birthday in each month.
- Have students collect data by asking their classmates who their favorite character is. Then have them create a graph to display the information they collected.

SCIENCE

- Discuss different types of flowers and gardens. Provide small planters, soil and seeds. Have the students plant the seed (I suggest sunflowers or Zinnias) and place in a well lit area. Observe the plants each day. If you have a lot of plants that do well and a place in the school yard, plant them outside to create a garden.
- Take a nature walk and discuss the different flowers you may see.
- Take a field trip to a florist to learn more about flowers.
- Discuss farms and farm animals.
- Discuss how farms and gardens are the same/different.
